## PREFACE

This is the third of three scheduled auctions offering $18^{\text {th }}$ Century Provincial Tokens from the Baldwin's historical stock: "The Baldwin Basement". The tokens have been acquired over the many generations at Baldwin's and have been off the market for at least a half-century, and most quite a bit longer. Baldwin's have been the privileged custodian of what has probably been the largest and most complete collection of tokens in the world, but the decision has been made finally to offer them to collectors via public auction. Many of the individual tokens can be traced directly to wellknown collections, including the John Dudman Collection (acquired privately by Baldwin's in 1914), the F S Cokayne Collection (acquired in its entirety in 1946), the A W Jan Collection (purchased by Baldwin's in 1955), and other sources, both private and public, including the Hamer Sale in 1930, Waite Sanderson in 1944, and Longman in 1958
This offering contains a substantial variety of tokens from Wales, Scotland and Ireland. The Anglesey Penny Tokens include over forty illustrated in D\&H. A similar number have the remains of a some cream/yellow coloured pigment on portions of the edge. One theory is that this pigment is all that remains from a more comprehensive application that was part of the plating process. There is, however, no evidence that there was ever any more than a small amount of pigment applied and it has been speculated that this was done by Richard Dalton as a way of distinguishing those in his possession

Dalton and Hamer did a remarkable job of identifying and recording the $18^{\text {th }}$ Century Scottish Farthings. Of the 198 varieties currently noted, 194 were listed by them, with three of the remaining four unconfirmed. Many are quite rare, some known only by a single specimen. 177 varieties, representing over $90 \%$ of the series, are offered in this auction.
Identification of $18^{\text {th }}$ Century varieties of Irish tokens has progressed substantially over the years. Denton \& Prattent listed 13 varieties of Halfpennies, Conder 77, Atkins 187, and D\&H 469. Since D\&H was published, nearly a century ago, another 214 varieties have been recorded, 162 by Gregg Silvis. Gregg's contributions have, clearly, been exceptional, and his attention to detail is gratefully reproduced in many of the descriptions provided.
The provincial tokens issued in the late $18^{\text {th }}$ Century in England, Wales, Scotland and Ireland form a complex series, essentially composed of a variety of types (as circulating coinage, store cards, political and social commentary, private tokens, and those made for collectors) and for a variety of purposes. There are genuine issues, counterfeits, medley tokens (mules and edge varieties), specious fabrications, restrikes, off metal trials and presentation pieces odd concoctions, as well as surviving artist's proofs and die trials. As a result, they may be organised, arranged, catalogued or collected in any one of a number of ways.

In the previous two auctions, the tokens had been arranged alphabetically by issuer. This was a choice made early on in the cataloguing process and was done to place a greater emphasis on the individuals responsible, instead of their assigned geographic location. This arrangement provides for a different sense of the quantity and variety of tokens issued by a specific individual, or individuals, or a company as the case may be, as well as facilitating the tracing of die links and states. The arrangement of tokens for this particular catalogue was a little more challenging. The lots are initially broken out by country with those in England listed by issuer as in earlier cataloguing efforts. Wales, Scotland and Ireland are arranged differently, generally first by location and then by issuer with the Scottish Farthings listed separately. An open question was where, exactly, to place those of uncertain origin (as well as Taylor's Ayrshire restrikes). Some are imitations and mules, while others stand alone. One option was to list them all (within each country) after all known issuers; another was to list the imitations directly after the genuine issue; a third was to place them in $\mathrm{D} \& \mathrm{H}$ order. This became a bit muddled as some of the imitations could be assigned to a known issuer, while others, not so much. I was also ambivalent about what to do with those that may be (or even likely) attributed to Lutwyche or Kempson. Die and edge linkages, and past associations notwithstanding, it is still conjecture at this point. So, for consistency, I've noted all of those as "Uncertain Issuer" and not "Lutwyche or Kempson" as I had once considered. Clearly there may be some concerns and for this, we can only hope that you will take the time to explore a path less travelled.

Citations are listed, where available, for Conder Pye, The Virtuoso's Companion and Atkins, as well as Dalton \& Hamer. There is reason for this. While Dalton \& Hamer seemed to have had access to part of Cokayne's collection prior to their publications, there is evidence that that may not have been the case with others. Nor were their efforts universally accepted. As late as 1936, Glendining's Sale of Frederick Lincoln's Collection was listed only according to Atkins and not Dalton \& Hamer's Provincial Token Coinage, although the latter had been completed and in print for nearly two decades. I was fortunate to have had access to Baldwin's extensive library that included not only annotated reference volumes and auction catalogues, but also Cokayne's personal notes that were invaluable in bridging the gap between James Atkins' Tradesmen's Tokens and Dalton \& Hamer, as well as confirming provenance and dates of acquisition.

These tokens have been well cared for, many having accumulated a patina from a century, or more, of storage. For the most part, the level of preservation is remarkable. As a result, it was possible to identify under-types and die states where it might have been impossible, had the tokens been subject to more extensive handling. They are being offered untouched and as a result some have a little dust and detritus adhering to them, some with the remnants of red casting wax (used to take an impression of the token to make plaster casts for early photogravure illustrations), and as a result much of the lustre and original colour can be well disguised. We have graded the tokens with this in mind and along international standards, mentioning the beautiful hidden lustre where it is evident.

It has been great fun, and an extraordinary privilege, exploring "Baldwin's Basement" and handling tokens that were once the prized possessions of dedicated collectors long passed. Now it is time for them to find new homes.

## Christ's Hospital

Founded in London by King Edward VI for the orphan children of poor Londoners and was given the use of the old Grey Friars buildings. It admitted its first 380 children in November 1552 and was given its Royal Charter by Edward VI in 1553, being part of a foundation, which included St Thomas's Hospital (for the sick) and Bridewell Hospital (for idle vagabonds). The school's Tudor uniform, which has been in place since it's founding, includes belted, long blue coats, knee-breeches, yellow socks, and bands at the neck. The name "Blue-coat School" comes from the blue coats worn by the students but the name used within the school community itself is "Housey" and the long coat is called a "housey coat". Beginning in 1800 Christ's Hospital minted its own coinage (Sixpence, Penny, Halfpenny), which were exchanged for the coin of the realm and could only be spent in shops within the site. They were known locally as Housey Money.

## William Lutwyche

(1754-1801), toymaker, later token manufacturer, Temple Row and St Philip churchyard. Lutwyche was active in the production of tokens from 1791 until 1801 and seems to have had more individual commissions for than any other manufacturer. His output of more than 65 tons of "legitimate provincial coins" was exceeded only by that of Thomas Williams, the consortium of Westwood and Hancock, and that of Matthew Boulton. He frequently combined dies then in his possession to produce various mules, concocted numerous specious issues, and has been attributed with manufacturing the bulk of evasions and lightweight coppers that appeared toward the end of the $18^{\text {th }}$ Century.

(1768-1794), button-maker, Birmingham. He engraved dies for William Lutwyche and is thought by Pye to have produced a limited number of tokens, as well.

## John Milton

(1759-1805), engraver and die-sinker with a shop at 3 Rolls-buildings, Fetter Lane, London. Appointed as Assistant Engraver at the Royal Mint in 1787 and was Medalist to the Prince of Wales. Milton executed dies for a number of provincial coins including those for Colonel Fullarton. Sir Joseph Banks noticed these dies while they were still in Milton's possession and, remarking upon their resemblance to national silver coin then in circulation, cautioned Milton against the project as the artist may be subject to "a charge little short of High Treason". The project was ultimately abandoned but Milton was later dismissed from the Royal Mint in 1798 after it was learned that he had been supplying counterfeit dies to produce foreign gold.

## Thomas Spence

(1750-1814), Newcastle schoolmaster and writer who moved to London in 1792, where he set up shop as a bookseller and became an active member of the London Corresponding Society. He allowed his home and shop to be used for meetings and, in May 1794, was arrested along with a dozen others, and remitted to Newgate Prison for his efforts. Upon release he entered the business of selling tokens, publishing a handbill listing twenty obverse and twenty reverse dies that could be ordered paired in any combination, and authoring an early guide to the series, The Coin Collector's Companion in 1795. He issued and sold a variety of tokens before quitting the business in late 1796. His stock and dies passed to Skidmore where they continued to be muled amongst themselves and with others then in Skidmore's possession.

## William Joseph Taylor

Originally trained under Halliday, he migrated to London in 1829 where he set up business first at 5 Porter Street in Soho then, subsequently, at 3 Litchfield Street, 33 Little Queen Street, and finally 70 Red Lion Street. Taylor manufactured a number of tokens and medals including those for Matthew Young, Benjamin Nightingale, and William Till. At some point Taylor came into the possession of a number of dies originally engraved for Soho Mint product and took to restriking those, perhaps at the request of others.

## John Wilkinson

(1728-1808), industrialist with interests in both iron and copper. He was successful in the development of a steam engine cylinder for the firm of Boulton \& Watt in 1775, later issuing large quantities of tokens ostensibly to pay his employees. The tokens were referred to as "Willy's" and were heavily counterfeited. His use of his own portrait on the tokens was the subject of a satirical tract in the London Magazine in 1787 . Wilkinson repeatedly reduced the weight of his tokens in an effort to shave costs and when he attempted to pay some of his employees in countersigned French assignats, parliament stepped in and stopped the practice in 1793.

## WALES

$18^{\text {th }}$ Century Halfpenny and Penny Tokens ascribed to Anglesey form a complex series and include patterns, trials, genuine issues, imitations, counterfeits, mules, and those made for collectors. Pye listed 25 varieties, whilst Conder lists 65. James Atkins greatly expanded the list to 293 and Dalton \& Hamer nearly doubled that to 557, mostly through the efforts of Frances Cokayne and Richard Dalton. It is a tribute to their efforts that in the ensuing century, less than three dozen new varieties have been noted, a third of which remain unconfirmed.

The Penny Tokens offered in the following lots include over forty illustrated in D\&H. A similar number have the remains of a little cream/yellow coloured pigment on portions of the edge. One theory is that this pigment is all that remains from a more comprehensive application that was part of the plating process. There is, however, no evidence that there was ever any more than a small amount of pigment applied and it has been speculated that this was done by Richard Dalton as a way of distinguishing those in his possession.

## Parys Mine Company

Thomas Williams, (1737-1802), attorney and businessman, part owner and managing partner of the Parys and Mona Mine Companies of Anglesey. He effectively gained control of the entire operations of the Parys Mountain and, later, the Cornish Metal Company, giving him a near monopoly over the development and production of copper and the copper trade in Great Britain.

## John Westwood Jnr

(1774-1850), medalist, die-sinker, and engraver, son of Obadiah Westwood and nephew of John Westwood, the elder. His name has been linked with various medals of a political nature including those of the Birmingham Association and Greatheed Petition although this is unconfirmed. What is known is that the younger Westwood was responsible for quite a few specious tokens and those made for collectors, including nearly thirty varieties of Half-Halfpennies that Dalton and Hamer distributed among eight separate counties.

## John Milton

(1759-1805), engraver and die-sinker with a shop at 3 Rolls-buildings, Fetter Lane, London. Appointed as Assistant Engraver at the Royal Mint in 1787 and was Medalist to the Prince of Wales. Milton executed dies for a number of provincial coins including those for Colonel Fullarton. Sir Joseph Banks noticed these dies while they were still in Milton's possession and, remarking upon their resemblance to national silver coin then in circulation, cautioned Milton against the project as the artist may be subject to "a charge little short of High Treason". The project was ultimately abandoned but Milton was later dismissed from the Royal Mint in 1798 after it was learned that he had been supplying counterfeit dies to produce foreign gold.

2.3. Coins are graded to accepted UK standards to the best ability of our specialists. ## 4. AUCTION SALE

7.2. For the purposes of these Conditions, a 'Forgery' means an imitation that has been created with the fraudulent intent to deceive in respect of the authorship, origin, date, age, period and the correct
description does not correspond with the description in the Catalogue and as a result has a value significantly less than it would have been had it been genuine.
7.3. You must notify us in writing within one month of you becoming aware that the Lot may be a Forgery. The Lot must be returned to us in the same condition as at the time of sale and you must submit evidence that the Lot is a Forgery, the onus being on you to prove that it is a Forgery.

### 7.4. You acknowledge that:

(a) we reserve the right to re-assess the Lot or engage at our expense any expert or authority considered by us at our sole discretion to have the necessary expertise to undertake a re-assessment of the Lot;
(b) following our re-assessment of the Lot, you agree to be bound by our decision as to whether or not the Lot is a Forgery.
7.5. You shall not be entitled to a refund for a Forgery if:
(a) the grounds for claiming that the Lot is a Forgery is based primarily on a difference of opinion between us and a third party providing coin grading services;
(b) the grounds for claiming that the Lot is a Forgery is by reason of any damage and/or restoration and/or modification work of any nature;
(c) the description of the Lot in the catalogue was in accordance with generally accepted opinions of numismatic specialists as at the date of publication or the catalogue indicated that there was a conflict of opinion.
(d) it has been proved that the Lot is a Forgery by applying a method that was unavailable or not generally applied within the industry of numismatics as at the date of publication of the catalogue or was disproportionately expensive, in both cases as determined in our absolute discretion.

### 7.6. If we agree that the Lot is a Forgery then subject to:

(a) you being able to confirm in writing that you can transfer legal and beneficial title to the Lot to us or as directed by us free from all encumbrances or third party claims of any nature; and
(b) the exclusions in Condition 7.7,
then the sale of the Lot will be rescinded so that it is cancelled and we will refund the Purchase Price to you in full.
7.7. Your right to return the Lot and receive a refund of the Hammer Price under the Guarantee is your sole remedy against us, our agents and subcontractors and/or the Seller for a Forgery. You will not be entitled to claim interest on the amount due to you. Neither we, our agents or sub-contractors nor the Seller shall be liable for costs, expenses, damages or any other liability however it arises relating to a Forgery.
7.8. In accordance with the restriction in Condition 10.2, the benefit of the Guarantee is personal to the original Buyer and is not transferable to a new owner of the Lot or any other person.

## 8. EXCLUSION OF LIABILITY

8.1. Except where these Conditions expressly state otherwise, no warranty is given to a Buyer concerning a Lot and each Lot is sold as shown with all faults, imperfections, errors of description (including authorship, origin, age, size, condition or value) or lack of authenticity or genuineness and neither we nor the Seller nor any of our agents or sub-contractors will be liable for any damages, costs, expenses or any other liability arising out of the same whether or not caused by negligence.
8.2. Our maximum liability under these Conditions is the amount of the Purchase Price paid by you.
8.3. Neither we nor any of our agents or sub-contractors shall be liable, whether in tort (including negligence or breach of statutory duty), contract, misrepresentation or otherwise:
(a) for loss of profits or business, depletion of goodwill and/or similar losses; loss of contracts; or
(b) any special, indirect, consequential or pure economic loss, costs, damages, charges or expenses.
8.4. We shall not be liable to you or be deemed to be in breach of these Conditions by reason of any delay in performing, or any failure to perform, any of our obligations in the Conditions, if the delay or failure was due to any cause beyond our reasonable control.
8.5. Nothing in these Conditions excludes or limits our liability for any matter which it would be illegal for us to exclude or attempt to exclude under English law or for our fraud or fraudulent misrepresentation.

## 9. DATA PROTECTION

9.1. By agreeing to these Conditions, a Bidder acknowledges and agrees that we will use personal information of a Bidder for the purpose of the auction and ancillary matters, including providing a Buyer's personal details to any other person where necessary to enforce our rights under these Conditions.

## 10. GENERAL

10.1. These Conditions and the Seller's Conditions constitute the entire agreement between us. All other terms, warranties and representations, express or implied by statute or otherwise are excluded to the fullest extent permitted by law. No variation to these Conditions shall be legally binding unless agreed in writing by us.
10.2. All rights and benefits granted to a Bidder under these Conditions are personal to him and may not be assigned or in any other way transferred to any other person. Any such assignment or transfer will be invalid and unenforceable against us.
10.3. A notice required or permitted to be given by either of us to the other under these Conditions shall, in the case of a Bidder, be to the last address notified to us and in the case of Baldwin's, shall be to its registered office.
10.4. No failure or delay by us in exercising any of our rights under these Conditions shall be deemed to be a waiver of that right, and no waiver by us of any breach of these Conditions by you shall be considered as a waiver of any subsequent breach of the same or any other provision.
10.5. We may perform our obligations and exercise our respective rights through any of our group companies or assign our rights under these Conditions.
10.6. If any provision of these Conditions is held by any court or other competent authority to be invalid or unenforceable in whole or in part, the validity of the other provisions and the remainder of the provision in question shall not be affected.
10.7. English law shall apply to these Conditions and we both agree to the English courts having exclusive jurisdiction.

## 11. INTERPRETATION

11.1. In these Conditions:
'Baldwins', 'auctioneer', 'us' or 'we' means A H Baldwin \& Sons Limited;
'Bidder' and 'you' means a person making, attempting to make or considering making a bid for a Lot including a Buyer;
'Buyer' means the person who makes the highest bid for a Lot which is accepted by the auctioneer and if the person is acting as an agent, will be a reference to its principal only if Baldwin's has accepted the agency in writing;
'Catalogue' means a catalogue, price list or other publication or price list;
'Commission Bid' means an instruction from a Bidder to us to bid on their behalf at the auction;
'Conditions' means these conditions of sale and any other additional terms notified to Bidders in writing in a Catalogue or otherwise (which includes notices displayed at the Auction) or as agreed in writing between Baldwin's and the Bidder;
'Guarantee' has the meaning set out in Condition 7.1;
'Hammer Price' means the amount of the highest bid for a Lot accepted by the auctioneer;
'including' or 'include' mean including without limitation and include without limitation, respectively;
'Lot' means any item deposited with us for sale at auction including items described against any Lot number in a Catalogue;
'Purchase Price' means the Hammer Price plus buyer's premium and VAT where applicable;
'Reserve' means a confidential price below which the auctioneer will not sell a Lot or will re-purchase on behalf of the Seller or for the account of Baldwin's. Unless otherwise specified at the time of Lot consignment, this will be set at approximately $80 \%$ of the Lot estimate at complete discretion of the auctioneer;
'Seller's Conditions' means the terms and conditions of sale between Baldwin's and a Seller for the sale of a Lot as displayed in the auction room, on our website or available from Baldwin's.
11.2. Headings in these Conditions are for convenience only and shall not affect their interpretation.
