

320 Louis XIII (1601-1610-1643), Lead Medal, 1617, laureate bust right, with bow and quiver, LVDOVICVS XIII REX CHRISTIANISS, *rev* Louis, naked and radiate, shoots arrow into monster, 49.5mm. *Fine*. £40-60

Philippe Regnault (active 1590s)



Charles X (1523-1589-1590), Copper Medal, 1590, crowned bust left, CAROLVS DECIMVS FRANCORVM REX, rev Royal crown, AVITA ET IVS IN ARMIS, 43mm (BMC [Jones] Vol I, 165, 166). Mid 18th century restrike, extremely fine, lightly rust-marked dies.

Charles, Cardinal de Bourbon, paternal uncle to Henri IV was proclaimed King in 1589. He died before the Coronation to which the medal alludes took place.

Anonymous (c.1590 and later)

- 322 Childeric I (c.440-457-c.481), Merovingian king of the Salien Francs, uniface fantasy cast Copper Medal, bust three-quarters right, wearing crown on hat, CHILDERICVS I REX FRAN 4, 42mm, perhaps 18th Century. *Very fine.*
- Jeanne III (1528-1555-1572), Queen of Navarre, also known as Joan III or Jeanne d'Albret, cast Bronze uniface oval medal, bust right wearing gown and bonnet, IOANNA REGINA NAVARRIE, 1572 in cartouche below, 58mm x 44mm. *An old cast (though uncertain age) very fine.* £60-80

The wife of Antoine de Bourbon, Duke of Vendôme, Jeanne III was the mother of Henry de Bourbon, who became King of Navarre and also of France.

François II (1544-1549-1560), and king consort of Scotland (1558-1560), uniface oval cast Bronze Medal, laureate and armoured bust right, FRANCISCVS II D G FRANCOR REX, 45mm x 40.5mm, within ornate raised border. *Very fine, pierced at top through border*. £70-90



Henri IV (1553-1589-1610), cast oval Bronze Medal, undated, laureate and armoured bust left, *rev* Pegasus rising above three allegorical female figures, PACE VIGENT ARTES, 49mm x 38mm. *An aftercast, fine, small piercing at top.*£50-80

Marguerite d'Estampes, oval cast Bronze Medal, bust right, hair tied back, wearing low-cut gown, rev crowned shield, VIRTVS NON PRIMA CORANAT, 52mm x 44mm. Small casting flaw before bust, pierced, nearly very fine.

327 Georges, Cardinal d'Amboise (1460-1510), Governor of Milan, Copper Medal, 1500, bust left wearing biretta, *rev* sun shines on cityscape of Milan, SALVAT VBI LVCET, 52mm (BMC [Jones] Vol I, 214). *Mid* 19th century restrike from broken obverse die, extremely fine.



Georges, Cardinal d'Amboise (1460-1510), Bronze Medal, 1503, bust left wearing biretta, *rev* an altar on which is placed the Papal tiara and Keys of St Peter, TVLIT ALTER HONORES, 52.5mm (BMC [Jones] Vol I, 215). *Mid* 19th century striking showing die flaw (from 6 o'clock to shoulder), extremely fine. £80-120



François I (1494-1515-1597), Complimentary struck Copper Medal, laureate and armoured bust left both sides, bearded on obverse, FRANCISCVS I FRANCORVM REX, 54mm (cf BMC [Jones] Vol I, 217, 218 & 219, 220). Mid 19th century striking, virtually mint state. £80-120



François de Lorraine, second duc de Guise (1519-1563), soldier and politician, struck Copper Medal, 1552, bust right in armour, FRANCISCVS DVX GVISIVS, *rev* cityscape of Metz with, to the fore, army encampments, HÆC TIBI META, 53mm (BMC [Jones] Vol I, 227; Maz II, 408; TN I, 45, 1). *Early* 19th century restrike, choice extremely fine.

The medal commemorates his successful defence of the city of Metz from the forces of the Emperor Charles V. Guise died when, during the Wars of Religion, and about to capture Orléans from the Huguenot supporters, he was wounded by an assassin and bled to death by his surgeons.



Anne de Montmorency (1493-1567), soldier and Constable of France, cast Copper Medal, undated, bearded bust left, ANNAS MOMMORANCIVS MILITAE GALLICAE PRAEF, rev Foresight standing between the figures of Land and Sea, uniting them, PROVIDENTIA DVCIS FORTISS AC FOELICISS, 53.5mm (BMC [Jones] Vol I, 228; Arm II 190,20; Maz II, 461; Pollard [2007] 634). Light patination, very fine. £250-300

de Montmorency, Maréchal (1522) and Constable (1538) de France was named for his godmother, Queen Anne of Brittany. He served under Francis I, Henry II and Charles IX. He helped negotiate the Peace of Cambrai in 1529. Wounded at the Battle of Saint-Denis (10 November 1567, during the Wars of Religion), he died two days later, his heart being placed next to the Monument of the Heart of Henry II in the church of the Celestines, Paris.



332 Anne de Montmorency (1493-1567), soldier and Constable of France, Gilt-bronze struck Medal, undated, bearded bust left, ANNAS MOMMORANCIVS MILITAE GALLICAE PRAEF, rev Foresight standing between the figures of Land and Sea, uniting them, PROVIDENTIA DVCIS FORTISS AC FOELICISS, 57mm, an 18th century restitution copying the cast medal in the previous lot (BMC [Jones] 229). Choice extremely fine.

Diana de Poitiers (1499-1566), Bronze Medal, bust left, DIANA DVX VALENTINORVM CLARISSIMA, rev Diana the huntress with bow, tramples on the cherub of Love, OMNIVM VICTOREM VICI, 52mm (BMC [Jones] Vol I, 231-233; Pollard [2007] 633). Mid or late 18th century restrike, extremely fine. £80-120

Diane de Poitiers, the noblewoman who became favorite mistress of Henri II, although 20 years his senior. She became Duchesse de Valentinois in 1548.



Diane de Poitiers (1499-1566), cast Lead Medal, bust left, DIANA DVX VALENTINORVM CLARISSIMA, rev Juno with her peacock waters with her breast-milk, a plant held by the reclining figure of Plenty, ORITVR ET LACTE VIRESCIT, 52.5mm (BMC [Jones] Vol I, 235). An old cast, very fine. £80-120

Jones (BMC) suggests Peace as the reclining figure on the reverse, though the cornucopiæ is more usually associated with Plenty. The reverse is first found on a medal of Henry II (BMC [Jones] 190/191), dated 1602.



Pomponne de Bellièvre (1606-1657), Chancellor, Copper Medal, 1602, after Conrad van Bloc, bearded bust right in magistrate's robes, *rev* Peace (the sun) dissipates clouds over rural landscape, 53mm (BMC [Jones] Vol I, 247). 17th – 18th century striking, extremely fine.

Pompone de Bellièvre, Magistrate, Statesman and Ambassador to England, 1645-1648, then first President of the Parlement de Paris (1653-1657). The reverse originally found on a medal of Henri IV (BMC [Jones] 200)

336 Pomponne de Bellièvre (1606-1657), Chancellor, Bell-metal Medal, 1601, perhaps after Conrad van Bloc, bearded bust left in magistrate's robes, signed and dated below truncation, NGI F, 53mm. Good fine, twice pierced to left and right.

Marie de Medici (1573-1642), Coronation, uniface struck Copper Medal, 1610, bust left wearing open high-standing collar, MARIA AUGUSTA MED FR REG MODERATRIX, 43mm, pierced and plugged to support suspension loop (BMC [Jones] Vol II, 88, obv; Maz II, 483, 487). An old, though not contemporary strike, extremely fine.

Marie de Medici (1573-1642), the Regency Established, struck Copper Medal, 1613, crowned bust right ornate dress and high collar, MARIA AVGVSTA MED FR REG, *rev* Marie as Juno with her peacock, seated on rainbow, DAT PACCATVM OMNIBVS ÆTHER, 53mm (BMC [Jones] Vol II, 90; Maz II, 562; TN II, 5, 3). *Late 18th century striking, virtually mint state.* £80-120

Jones (BMC) incorrectly gives the reverse legend as "PACATVM"



339 Louis XIII (1601-1610-1643) and Marie de' Medici (1573-1642), Regent, struck Copper Medal, 1614, laureate and armoured bust right, *rev* bust of Marie left, wearing standing lace collar, 45mm (BMC [Jones] Vol II, 91; Maz II, 801). *Extremely fine*. £80-120

Jones (BMC 91, note), suggests that the obverse is likely to be the work of Nicholas Briot



Charles d'Albert, duc de Luynes, Copper Medal 1621, 19th century restrike, bust right in elaborate armour and ruff, CH DALBERT DVC D LVYNES PAIR ET CONEST D FR, *rev* a mailed hand from the clouds, holding sword above a landscape, QVO ME IVRA VOCANT ET REGIS GLORIA, 56mm (BMC [Jones] Vol II, 94). *Extremely fine, perhaps once lacquered.* £120-150



341 Louis XIII (1601-1610-1643), Copper Medal, Building an Extension to the Louvre, 1624, laureate bust right, rev façade of the Louvre, POSCEBANT HANC FATA MANVM, 33.5mm, struck with integral suspension loop (BMC [Jones] Vol II, 95; Maz 489). Sharp extremely fine, reverse with traces of original redness.

Louis XIII laid the foundation stone in 1624 and these medals were struck both to be laid in the foundations and also for distribution.

Louis XIII (1601-1610-1643), Nicolas de Bailleul's third term as Provost of the Merchants of Paris, Copper Medal, 1628, youthful laureate bust right, hint of beard and moustache, LVDOVIC XIII D G FRANCORVM ET NAVAR REX, rev the armorial ship of Paris, DE LA 3 PTE DE MRE N DE BAILLEVL PRESIDT AV PARLEM, 38mm. Good very fine.

Nicolas de Bailleul (1586-1652), marquis de Château-Gontier was President of the Mortier of the Paris Parliament and from 1643-1647, Superintendent of Finances

348 Armand-Jean Duplessis (1585-1642), Cardinal Richelieu, cast Bronze Tribute Medal, 1631, bust right wearing biretta and robes, signed below, ARMANVS IOAN CARD DE RICHELIEV, rev globe within circle of stars, guided by a winged genius, MENS SIDERA VOLVIT, 50.5mm, cast with integral shaped suspension loop (BMC [Jones] 187-192; Jones, Warin, 5; Pollard [2007] 662; Kress 576; Mol 251; Clifford 455-458; Baldwin's Auction 31, lots 1040-1041). A contemporary cast with light patination, very fine. £150-200



Pierre Séguier, Keeper of Seals and Chancellor of France, cast Bronze Medal, 1633, bust right, PETRVS SEGVIER EQVES FRANCIÆ NOMOPHYLAX, rev Justice seated by an altar onto which Piety, with children, pours incense, 70mm. (BMC [Jones] Vol II, 193). A high quality cast with orange patina to the reverse.



350 François de Bassompierre (1579-1646), cast gilt Lead Medal, 1633, bust right with lace collar over armour with lion shoulder plate, wearing St Ésprit, FR A BASSOMPIERRE FRANC POLEM GLIS HELV V PRAEF, rev ships sail around a lighthouse under a starry sky, QVOD NEQVEVNT TOT SIDERA PRESTAT, 52.5mm (BMC [Jones] Vol II, 194; Maz II, 843; Maz, Warin I, 69; Martin 29). An early cast with minor test marks on reverse, very fine

An unfortunate casting flaw has removed a section of the edge below the truncation, 8 – 6 o'clock, very fine with dark patination. £80-120

de Bassompierre was Colonel-General of the Swiss in 1614 and Maréchal de France in 1622. He was with the army of the king during the Siege of La Rochelle in 1628, and in 1629 distinguished himself in the campaign against the rebels of Languedoc. He served, somewhat unsuccessfully, as an ambassador to Spain, Switzerland and, in 1626, to England. In 1631 he was incarcerated in the Bastille, being released in 1643 on the death of Richelieu.



Louis XIII (1601-1610-1643), cast Bronze Medal, 1635, laureate and armoured bust left, mantle over shoulders, LVDOVICVS XIII D G FRANC ET NAVAR RE[X], rev key hangs from crossed sceptres, ALITER NON VIRIBVS VLLIS, 47mm (BMC [Jones] 197, obverse). Very fine with light patination, pierced between D and G and through last numeral of date.

353 Gaston Jean-Baptiste de France, duc d'Orléans (1608–1660), here called Gaston de Bourbon, uniface Lead Medal, bust right wearing lace collar over armour and sash, GASTON DE BOVRBON, 55mm (TN II, VII, 4; cf BMC [Jones] 198, a left-facing uniface medal). Two small piercings at top, very fine. £120-150

Gaston was the third son of the king of France Henry IV and Marie de' Medici and brother of Louis XIII. His first marriage, on 6 August 1626, was to Marie de Bourbon, Duchesse de Montpensier. The medal is recorded in Trésor with the reverse of Justice standing by a column surmounted by a Sphinx, with the legend, JVRISQVE ÆNIGMATA SOLVENS REDDIT CVI^{VE} SVVM.

Anne de Rohan, Princess de Guémené (1606-1685), cast Bronze Medal, 1638, draped bust right, ANNE DE ROHAN PRINCESSE DE GVEMENE, rev three eagles above pastoral landscape, SPES DVRAT AVORVM, 52mm, integral suspension loop (BMC [Jones], 199; TN II, 29, 2). Reverse very fine, the obverse better.

The three eagles represent Anne and her two brothers, Henri, duc de Rohan and Benjamin, prince de Soubise.



Anne de Rohan, Princesse de Guémené (1606-1685), cast Bronze Medal, 1638, bust right in classical drapery, hair in chignon but with love-locks on shoulders, ANNE DE ROHAN PR[I]NCESSE DE GVEMENE, signed below truncation, rev three eagles fly above a rural landscape towards the sun, SPES DVRAT AVORVM, dated 1638 in exergue, 55.5mm (BMC [Jones] 199; TN II, 29, 2). Cast on a thin flan, the obverse smoothed to a sharp finish, extremely fine though pierced through I of PRINCESSE. £150-200

The attribution to Jean Warin is by no means certain. The Philadelphia Museum of Art holds a wax portrait by Jean Warin from which, perhaps, the medal is taken.

356 Louis XIV (1638-1643-1715), and Anne of Austria (1601-1666), the King's Accession, cast Bronze Medal, 1643, laureate bust right with sash over armour, LVDOVICVS XIII DG FR ET NAV REX, rev bust of Anne right wearing mourning veil and clothes, ANNA DG FR ET NAV REG, 54mm, cast with integral suspension loop (BMC [Jones] 200; Maz, Warin 14; TN II, 22, 4). Extremely fine and original, unpatinated, colour.



Louis XIV (1638-1643-1715), and Anne of Austria (1601-1666), uniface cast Bronze Medal, 1645, the young King faces his mother and holds the tassel of her gown, ANNA D G FR ET NAV REG RE R MATER LVD XIV D G FR ET NAV REG CHR, rev inverted image, cast on a thin flan, 96mm (BMC [Jones] 208; Maz Warin I 60; "Louis XIV" 130; Molinari 276; 59). Good very fine. £300-500



Cardinal Mazarin, Chief Minister of France (1602-1642-1661), Battle of Casale, Bronze Medal, bust of Mazarin right, rev soldier riding between two armies, with the intention of negotiating terms, in the distance the city, 49mm (BMC [Jones] Vol II, 212). Extremely fine contemporary cast with light brown patina.

de Silvecane was also President of the Cour des Monnaies



Philippe Croppet, Lord of Pontournis, uniface cast Bronze Medal, 1651, bust right wearing cap and gown, hair long, PHIL CROPPET IN ARCHIP LVGD ET ABBAT ATHEN IVDEX, signed and dated below truncation, beaded border, rev inverted image, 103mm (BDM VI, 354, illus). Extremely fine with dark patination.

Croppet also a Doctor of Human Justice in the archbishopric of Lyons and the Royal Abbey of Ainay; Deputy Mayor of Lyon [1656].

Gaspard de Monconys (d. 1664), collector of curiosities, uniface cast Bronze Medal, 1651, bust right wearing cap and gown, signed below truncation, GASP MONCO LIERGV LVGD IVR CRIM PRÆT, beaded border, rev inverted image, 106mm (BDM VI 357). Good brown patination, nearly extremely fine.

Together with his brother Balthazar, de Monconys amassed a collection of machine models created by Grollier de Servière who also published a catalogue of the collection.



366 Amans Dalichons, uniface cast Bronze Medal, 1652, bust right in cap and gown, AMANS DALICHOVS IN CIVIT LVGDVNENSI CONSVL, signed and dated below truncation, beaded border, rev inverted image, 104mm (BDM VI 357). Good very fine, old collection number "189" inked in field before the bust. £250-350

367 Nicolas de Neufville de Villeroy (1598-1685), Governor of Lyons, uniface cast Bronze Medal, 1651, armoured bust right with lion shoulder-plate, hair long and wearing plain lace collar and scarf, signed and dated below truncation, NIC DE NEVFVILLE MARCH VILL GALL MARESC REG PER S ET LVGD MODER, beaded border, rev inverted image, 103mm, integral suspension loop (BMC [Jones] 306; BDM VI, 353, illus; Rondot 11). Extremely fine.

de Neufville was Marquis then [1651] First Duke of Villeroy, other titles include Marquis d'Alincourt, Lord of Magny and a Marshal of France. He was one of the several lovers of Catherine-Charlotte de Gramont. The medal was commissioned by the Consulate of Lyons in 1651.



368 Madeleine de Créquy (1609-1675), uniface cast Bronze Medal, 1651, draped bust right, signed and dated below truncation, MAGDELENE DE CREQUY MARESCHALE DE FRANCE, beaded border, *rev* inverted image, 103mm, integral suspension loop (BMC [Jones] 307; BDM VI, 353, TN II, 29, 1-2; Rondot 12). *Extremely fine*. £150-250

This medal, together with that of Camille de Neufville in the following lot, was commissioned by the Consulate of Lyons in 1651. Madeleine de Créquy married Nicholas de Neufville, Marquis de Villeroy in 1617 (for whom see previous lot and lot 385, a medal by Bidau).

369 Camille de Neufville (1606-1693), Archbishop of Lyon, uniface cast Bronze Medal, 1651, bust right in jerkin tied with tassel, signed and dated below truncation, CAM DE NEVFVILLE ABB ATHAN PROR EX LVGDVNENSIS, beaded border, rev inverted image, 104mm, cast with integral suspension loop (BMC [Jones] 309; Rondot 15). Extremely fine.

Camille de Neufville, Comte de Lyon and Primate of the Gauls [1653-1693], was the brother of Nicholas de Neufville, Marquis de Villeroy in 1617 (for whom see lot 385, a medal by Bidau). He was appointed Abbé d'Ainay in 1621 and Archbishop of Lyon in 1654. The medal was commissioned by the Consulate of Lyons in 1651. He owes his Christian name to Camillo Borghese, Pope Paul V.



370 Charles Grolier, lawyer and prévôt des marchands de Lyon (1650-52, 1673-75), uniface cast Bronze Medal, 1651, bust right wearing cap and gown, signed and dated below truncation, CAROLVS GROLIER PRÆ MERC LVGD, beaded border, rev inverted image, 105mm, integral suspension loop (BDM VI, 353). He was one of the several lovers of Catherine-Charlotte de Gramont. Bidau was a pupil of Claude Warin for whom de Neufville also sat for a medal [Jones 306]. The pupil's medal is the more impressive.



GERMANY and BOHEMIA

Hans Reinhardt the Elder (active 1535-1568)

Hans Reinhart the Elder was born in Dresden around 1510 and was active in Torgau, prior to living in Leipzig from 1539 until his death in 1581. Evidence of his career begins in 1535 when he produced a pair of carved limestone portrait reliefs of Elector Johann Friedrich (1532-1554) and his wife Sibylle of Cleves, for the entrance to the staircase at Schloss Hartenfels at Torgau. Writing in *The Medal* no.56, Spring 2010, J Chipps Smith likens Friedrich's limestone portrait to Reinhart's medal of the same sitter, lots 419, 420 and 421 below, and comments that both portraits are based on a likeness supplied by Lucas Cranach the Elder. It is believed that from 1544 Reinhart was obliged to concentrate on his work as a goldsmith after officials from Leipzig's Goldsmiths Guild argued that producing medals in silver made him subject to their regulation. While Reinhart challenged this he lost his case and was ironically reduced to becoming an apprentice with Georg Truetler for five years. Amongst the very restricted amount of new medallic work he produced in this period is his masterpiece the Trinity, lot 418, also known as the *Morriz-pfennig* as it was commissioned by Duke Morritz (elector 1547-1553).

Hans Reinhart the Elder (c.1510-1581), The Trinity or *Moritz-pfennig*, Silver Medal 1544, on an ornate throne decorated with floral design, God the Father, seated facing, holding orb and sceptre, wearing an imperial crown and jewelled cope, before him Christ on the crucifix, surmounted by a Dove representing the Holy Spirit, angels attend in prayer on clouds either side of the throne, above them the heads of cherubim ascending to the heavens, PROPTER SCELVS MEI PERCVSSI EVM ESAIAE LIII [I have smitten him for my people's transgression, Isaiah 53], *rev* two angels standing on a cloud support a tablet inscribed with an excerpt from the Athanasian Creed and a prayer to the Trinity, around REGNANTE MAVRITIO D G DVCE SAXONIAE _{ZC} GROSSVM HVNC LIPSIAE H R CVDEBAT AN^o MDXLIIII MENSE IANV [in the reign of Maurice, by the grace of God, Duke of Saxony etc. Hans Reinhart cast this medal in Leipzig in the month of January 1544], 100mm (Habich 1962, pl.207, 1 and pl.209, 1; Scher 127). *Beautifully cast and finely chased, iridescently toned, the lightest wear to some high points and without damage, a medal of the finest quality.*£60,000-80,000

This medal is without question a masterpiece of Northern European Renaissance art. In work produced for Maurice's cousin, Johann Friedrich, Reinhart had incorporated symbols and references sympathising with the Lutheran movement, clearly stating the Elector's religious affiliation. In this piece, through the incorporation of the Athanasian Creed with its theological relevance to both Protestants and Catholics alike at this juncture, Maurice attempts, through art, a reconciliation between the two churches. Highly prized then as now, copies of the medal were cast in 1556, 1561, 1569 and 1574, the last three in the name of Elector August, Maurice's successor.
