

Franz Joseph (1830-1916), International Exhibition, Vienna, Bronze Award Medal, 1873, by J Tautenhayn, bust of Franz Joseph to right, *rev* figures of Labour and Industry, 71mm. *Extremely fine*. £70-90



Crown Prince Emperor Rudolf (1858-1889), Suicide, oval Silver Medal, by C Ravnitsky, uniformed bust left, *rev* arms (not listed in the main references). *As struck, scarce.* £150-200

104 Austria/Croatia/Hungary, Assassination of Elizabeth of Bavaria, Empress of Austria, Queen of Hungary, Bohemia and Croatia, 10th September 1898, oval Silver Medal, bust of Elizabeth left, *rev* legend in oak and laurel wreath, 41mm x 35mm. *Extremely fine*. £80-120

Elizabeth was stabbed in the chest by an anarchist shortly before boarding a steamship from Geneva to Montreux. The seriousness of her situation was not clear until after she boarded the ship and her corset was removed, at which point, with the wound no longer compressed, she bled to death.



Archduke Charles (1887-1922, Emperor 1916-1918) and Archduchess Zita (1892-1989), Birth of Crown Prince Otto (Franz Joseph) von Habsburg, 1912, Bronze Medal, by Weinburger, conjoined busts of the Royal couple, *rev* the infant Prince being borne by a large eagle, 60mm. *Extremely fine and charming*. £70-90



106 Archduke Otto von Habsburg (1912-2007), Crown Prince of Austria and Hungary, Bronze Medal, 1917, by H Kautsch, bust of Archduke Otto to right, *rev* crowned armorial shield, 65mm. *Extremely fine*. £70-90



Cathedral Church of St Martin, Liege, 600th Anniversary, Copper Medal, 1847, by J & L Wiener, interior with arched roof, looking toward the high altar, names of priests around in small Gothic script, *rev* arms of Pope Pius IX and Archbishop with names and arms of 19 Prelates around in Gothic arches, outer legend, all in minute Gothic script, 74mm (van H 34; Kamp 11). *Nearly extremely fine*. £80-120



Albert (1875-1909-1934) and Elizabeth (1876-1965), World War I, Appeal for Help, Silver Medal, 1916, by G Devreese (and Fonson), busts left, *rev* St Christopher with infant Christ, AIDONS-NOUS MUTUELLEMENT, 89.5mm, numbered "10" on edge. *Matt surface, extremely fine*. £100-150



Henri Pirenne (1862-1935), historian, Bronze Medal, 1933, by Rau, head left, *rev* oak saplings grow from severed trunk, medieval and modern helmets to either side, HISTOIRE de BELGIQUE, 70mm. *Extremely fine*. £50-70

The medal commemorates the publication of Pirenne's multi-volume history of Belgium.



110 Semi-Centenary of the establishment of Tramways, 1885-1935, large Silvered-bronze Medal, by Huygelen, three female figures encircle a terrestrial globe, *rev* three large winged wheels, encircled by a three-line legend, 81mm. *Nearly extremely fine and scarce*. £100-120

Croatia



Livio I Odescalchi, Duke of Bracciano, Sirmio and Ceri (1652-1713), Copper Medal, 1699, by Ferdinand de Saint Urbain, bust right with long, flowing hair, *rev* palace and formal gardens at Lake Bracciano, TVETVR ET ARCET, 60mm (Mirnik 12; Molinari 114; Clifford 264; HCz 4802; Mus Mazz II, 233, pl 155). *Extremely fine*.

Livio Odescalchi, a nephew of Pope Innocent XI, acquired the town of Ilok in the late 17th Century and the palace he built there is still home to the Odescalchi Collection. Clifford (Spink, 21 May 1996), wrote of the specimen in his collection, "Undoubtedly the grandest medal commissioned by Odescalchi".



Livio I Odescalchi, Duke of Bracciano, Sirmio and Ceri (1652-1713), Silvered-bronze Medal, by Antonio de Gennaro, bust right with flowing hair, *rev* winged cherub with trumpet and cornucopiæ, from which falls a princely crown and papal tiara, 35mm (Mirnik 7; HCz 9808; Clifford 261). *Extremely fine though stained on the obverse and small scratch marks below cornucopiæ on the reverse.* £250-300

Christian VII (1766-1808), Visit to England, Pewter Medal, 1768, by Westwood, bust left, *rev* text (BHM 130); The Battle of Copenhagen, Silver Medal, 1801, by Loos, Roman soldier hands a sword to Justice, *rev* the defeat of a many-headed sea monster representing the English fleet, 39mm (Bergsøe 32). *Second bright, good extremely fine, the first good very fine and rare.* (2) £150-200



Princess Louisa Augusta (1771-1843), Duchess of Augustenborg, birthday, Silver Medal, by Loos, bust left in flowing costume, *rev* the three graces decorated with roses, at an altar, 41mm. *Very fine, scarce.*£150-200

Frederick VI (1808-1839), Silver Medal, 1822, by J Conradsen, on the Recovery of the King, head right, rev altar, SALVO REGE SALVA PATRIA, 47mm (Forrer p.451). Extremely fine. £80-120



Frederick VI (1808-1839), Silver Medal, 1836, by F C Krohn, 300th anniversary of the introduction of reformation in Denmark, head of Frederick right, *rev* figures of Religion and Denmark, 55mm (Whiting 685). *Extremely fine*. £250-350



Frederick VI (1808-1839), Silver Medal, 1836, by C Christensen, 300th anniversary of the introduction of reformation in Denmark, head of Christian III three-quarters facing left, *rev* Religion and Denmark, 55mm (Whiting 687), *extremely fine*; Frederick IV (1699-1730), 200th year of the Reformation, Silver Medal, by P Borg (Galster 309), *very fine*. President Gamal Abdel Nasser Hussein (1918-1956-1970), Silvered-bronze Medal, 1963, head left, rev Egyptian ship sails to left, arabic legends both sides, 80mm. Extremely fine. £140-180



The Shoura [Shura] Council Established, Silver Medal, 1980, dome of the Parliament building, Arabic legend above and below with wreath, *rev* lotus border, scrolled Arabic legend, ASSEMBLEE DE LA SHOURA EGYPTE 1980, 80mm, 207.90g, in blue velvet case of issue. *Virtually mint state*. £150-200

The Shura Council was created in 1980, comprising 264 members of whom 174 members are directly elected and the 88 are appointed by the President for six-year terms. Membership rotates, with half of the Council renewed every three years.

Finland



Gabriel Ahlman (1737-1799), educationalist and public benefactor, Silver Medal, 1801, by C Enhorning, bust to right, *rev* landscape with mountain and trees, dwelling in foreground, 33mm. *Extremely fine*.

France



Heraclius I (610-611), cast Bronze Medal c.1400, crowned bust of Heraclius on crescent moon, the sun's rays above, *rev* the Emperor riding in a car drawn by three horses, Greek inscriptions, 95mm (Kress 525). *An old cast, drill-pierced at 12 o'clock, very fine.* £150-250



Henri II (1519-1547-1559), French Victories against the Holy Roman Empire, struck Bronze Medal, 1552, laureate and armoured bust right, with high collar, HENRIVS II GALLIARVM REX INVICTISS PP, rev Victory and Plenty in a quadriga driven by Fame blowing trumpet with French flag, OB RES IN ITAL GERM ET GAL FORTITER AC FOELIC CESTAS, 56mm (BMC [Jones] Vol I, 64, 65; Maz II, 89; Arm III, 285; Pollard [2007] 871). A sharp cast, drill-pierced, extremely fine with pleasant brown patina.



Jean Lautens (1531- after 1598), Chief Officer of the Chamber of Accounts at Lille, cast Silver Medal, 1598, by Jacques Jonghelinck, bust right, in wide ruff, JEHAN LAVTENS CONS ET ME DE COMP A LILE, rev three interconnected rings, HAVTS AL IN EEN, 45mm (BDM VII, p.489). A little tooling, good very fine.



Nicolas Brulart, Seigneur de Sillery (1544-1624), Chancellor of France, cast Bronze Medal, 1612, by Conrad Bloc [unsigned], bust right, NICOLAVS BRVLART D. DE SILLERI FRAN. ET NAVARR. CANC., dated below, rev standing figure of Justice holding scales and cornucopiæ, AEQVITAS, 48.5mm (Maz 854; Trésor I, LIX; BDM I, 197). Fine, attempted piercing. £50-70

Henri III (1574-1589), restrike complimentary Bronze Medal, 1588, bust of Henri right, rev HAEC MVLTIS, HAEC CVNCTIS, the field divided in two showing the people blessed by the generosity of the king and defended by his armies, 46mm (Trésor pl XXIII, 8). Extremely fine. £70-90

An old restrike with less die-breakage than the example used to illustrate Trésor in 1836.



Armand-Jean Duplessis (1585-1642), Cardinal Richelieu, restrike Copper Medal, 1631, bust right wearing biretta and robes, *rev* globe within circle of stars, guided by a winged genius, MENS SIDERA VOLVIT, 52mm, mid 19th century (BMC [Jones] 187-192; Jones, *Warin*, 5; Pollard [2007] 662; Kress 576; Mol 251). *Extremely fine*.



Anonymous (c.1590 and later), Anne de Montmorency (1493-1567), soldier and Constable of France, restrike Copper Medal, undated, bearded bust left, ANNAS MOMMORANCIVS MILITAE GALLICAE PRAEF, rev Foresight standing between the figures of Land and Sea, uniting them, PROVIDENTIA DVCIS FORTISS AC FOELICISS, 53.5mm (BMC [Jones] Vol I, 228). About extremely fine. £30-50



Jean de Fourcy, uniface cast Lead Medal, unsigned, [1599], bearded bust right with high ruff collar, IEHAN DE FOVRCY S DE CHESSY ET DE POMMEVSE, rev inverted image, 39mm (BMC [Jones] 256; Maz II, 442). Minute piercing, very fine. £80-120

de Fourcy was secrétaire des finances du roi and surintendant des bâtiments

Nicolas de Verdun (d 1627), first President of the Parliament of Paris, the restoration of the *Parlement* building, cast Bronze Medal, 1617, by the 'S' Medallist, bust left wearing gown, NIC VIRDVNVS SENATVS GALL PRINCEPS – MDCXVII, *rev* statue of Justice within small round temple (of Themis), TEMPLVM THEMIDIS RESTITVTVM – S, 42.5mm (BMC [Jones] 336, obv; Trésor I, 56, 4). *Large piercing and smaller, broken, piercing, very fine.* £70-90



Henri de la Tour d'Auvergne, Vicomte de Turenne (1611-1675), military leader and Marshal General of France, Bell Metal Tribute Medal, undated, by Giovanni Hamerani, laureate bust left, wearing sash over armour, PR HENR A TVR ARV VIC TVREN, *rev* standing figures of Mars and Justice to either side of Peace, VIRTVS HONOS AEQVUTAS, 50.5mm (Johnson I, 170). *Extremely fine*. £120-150





- Jean Baptiste Duval, Royal Interpreter of Oriental Languages, uniface Lead 'Squeeze' of a portrait Medal, unsigned, 1630, draped armoured bust right, IO BAPTISTA DV VAL LING ORIENT INTERPRES REG, 55mm. Very fine. £120-150
- Alexandre de Sève, Chevalier, Seigneur de Chatignonville, uniface cast Bronze Medal [1661], bust right wearing gown, ALEX DE SEVE VRB PAR PRAEF IIII, 49mm (BMC [Jones], II, 352). *Very fine*. £80-120

de Sève was a noted numismatist with a collection of ancient coins that included 700-800 large bronze medallions. He periodically held an *Académie de médaillistes* at his house. He was Provost of the Paris Merchants, 1655-1662.



Louis XIV (1638-1643-1715), erection of the Statue at the Place des Victoires 1686, Bronze Medal, laureate bust draped and cuirassed right, LVDOVICVS MAGNVS REX CHRISTIANISSIMUS, rev the Statue, PATRI EXERCITVM ET DVCTORI SEMPER FELICI (Jacquiot p.432). Die cracks to obverse, nearly extremely fine.



137 Louis XIV (1638-1643-1715), cast Bronze Tribute Medal, 1689, by Giovanni Hamerani, laureate bust right, in armour, sun in majesty on breastplate, rev Minerva empties her cornucopiæ of coins to a grateful Francia, OPTIMI PRINCIPIS ÆTERNA BENEFICIA, 60mm, good very fine; Three Victories, large Silver-plated Copper Medal, 1690, by Roettiers and Roussel, rev VICTORIA OBSEQVIENS, 72mm, very fine. (2)



Maximilian Titon (died 1711), Seigneur d'Ognon, de Bêtra, Istres and Lançon, Copper Portrait Medal, 1705, by H Roussel, bust right with long hair, *rev* Mars and Victory, military trophies, 57mm (BDM V, 255-256). *A minor mark, extremely fine.*

Titon, of Scottish descent, was Secretary to the King, House and Crown of France and Director of the Royal Arsenals



Louis-Alexandre de Bourbon (1678-1737), Jeton de Marine, Copper, 1719, bust right, *rev* loaded mortar, QUANTUS CUM SE EXERET ARDOR, 29mm (Feu 1312; MH 326). *Nearly extremely fine*. £120-150

Louis Alexandre de Bourbon, who had many titles, comte de Toulouse (1681), duc de Penthièvre (1697), d'Arc, de Châteauvillain and de Rambouillet (1711), (6 June 1678 – 1 December 1737), was the son of Louis XIV and Madame de Montespan. He had been created a Grand Admiral of France at the age of five.

André-Hercule de Fleury (1653-1743), cardinal and chaplain to Queen Marie-Thérèse, Bronze Medal, 1736, by J Dassier, facing bust, *rev* caduceus formed of a club amid attributes of Arts, Commerce and Science, HIS FACEM REDDIT ARMIS above, 55mm (BDM I/514). *Obverse lightly burnished, good very fine*. £50-70



Louis XV (1715-1774), Copper Medals (2), Louis Departs for Flanders, 1744, and Battle of Fontenoy, 1745 (Divo 112, 129); Louis XVI (1774-1791), the Abolition of his Privileges, Copper Medal, 1789, by B Duvivier and N Gatteaux, 65mm (Julius 49; Henin 59). First two extremely fine, the last nearly extremely fine. (3)



142 1st Republic, Crossing the Tagliamento and the Capture of Trieste, Copper Medal, An V, 1797, by Lavy, River God of the Tagliamento lets the troops pass whilst the Austrians retreat, *rev* within wreath, A L'ARMEE D'ITALIE, 43mm (Hennin 788; Julius 546). *Extremely fine*. £80-120

Napoleon I, Copper Medal, An VI, 1797, uniformed bust left, hair en-queue, BONAPARTE NE A AJACCIO LE 15 AOUT 1769, *rev* legend in four lines within wreath, LA FRANCE LUI DEVRA LA VICTOIRE ET LA PAIX, corded edge, 33mm (Hennin 834; Julius 595). *Extremely fine*. £100-150



Napoleon I, First Consul, The Colonne Nationale placed in the Place Vendôme, Silver Medal, 1800, by Benjamin Duvivier, uniformed bust right over names of the second and third Consuls, BONAPARTE PREMIER CONSUL, *rev* legend in seven lines and around, 56mm, edge plain (Br 61; Julius 835). *Good very fine*.



Napoleon I, The Peace of Luneville, Silver Medal, 1801, by J-P Droz, uniformed bust left, BONAPARTE PR CONSUL DE LA REP FRAN, rev sun rises over a peaceful Europe, BONHEUR AU CONTINENT, 55mm, 66.27g (Br 106; Julius 902). The medal an original striking with (unfortunate) piercing above head (for attachment of suspension loop), edge nick by R of REP, toned, otherwise good very fine and rare. £150-200



Napoleon Bonaparte, Coronation Celebrations, Silver Medal, 1804, by N Brenet, conjoined busts of Napoleon and Josephine right, *rev* laureate French eagle, edge plain, 35mm (Br 359). *Extremely fine with some steel-blue iridescent toning, rare in silver.* £150-180



Napoleon I, circular framed Bronze Plaquette, mid-19th Century, uniformed bust left on radiating background, within heavy bronze laurel wreath frame, overall 105mm. *Nearly extremely fine*. £100-150 Believed to have been made c.1840, at the time of the return of Napoleon's body to France.



Joseph Haydn, Homage paid by the Orchestra of the Theatre des Arts to Haydn's oratorio, The Creation, Bronze Medal, 1800, by Nicolas Gatteaux, bust of Haydn to left, rev lyre in centre, two-line inscription around, 55mm (Julius 870; Niggl 863; Bramsen 88). Extremely fine and attractively patinated with traces of original colour.



- Baptism of the King of Rome, Bronze Medal 1811, by Andrieu, Napoleon holds his son above a baptismal font, *rev* A L'EMPEREUR LES BONNES VILLES DE L'EMPIRE in three lines within border of crowns, 68mm (Trésor pl 50,13; Julius 2462). *About extremely fine*. £150-250
- Baptism of the King of Rome, Bronze Medal 1811, by Andrieu, Napoleon holds his son above a baptismal font, *rev* A L'EMPEREUR LES BONNES VILLES DE L'EMPIRE in three lines within border of crowns, 68mm (Trésor pl 50,13; Julius 2462). *Another similar, about extremely fine.* £150-250



Napoleon III (Emperor, 1852-1870), Exhibition and Palace of Industry, Bronze Medal, 1855, by E A Oudiné, large bust of Napoleon III to left, *rev* façade of the exhibition building, 68mm (Divo 239). *Extremely fine*. £70-90



Napoleon III (Emperor, 1852-1870), Department of Agriculture and Trade, Gold Dedication Medal, 1863, laureate head of the Emperor left, *rev* dedication legend in six lines: MR. / SYLVOZ / A ST. JEOIRE / (SAVOIE) / DEFONCEMENTS / ARBORICULTURE / 1863, around: MINISTERE DE L'AGRIC.re DU COMMERCE ET DES TRAVAUX PUB.cs., edge: OR and bee, 42mm, 54.88g (cf Collignon, Napoléon III 2057 ss). *Extremely fine*. £2000-2500



Sebastien Priest, Marquis de Vauban (1633-1707), Maréchal de France, engineer, architect and military planner, large uniface Bronze Plaquette, 1870, by Léon Breuil (1825-1901), bewigged bust left, name around, 190mm. *Handsome style, somewhat stained, very fine*. £80-120



Destruction and Re-building of the Palais de la Légion d'Honneur, Silvered-copper Medal, 1871, by Raoul, legend in seven lines, beaded border, *rev* open book, gilt and blank, 45mm, suspension loop and ring. *Good very fine, very rare.* £500-600

The Palais was burnt down during the Paris Commune, 22 May, 1871. It was later reconstructed with the support of funds raised among recipients of the Légion d'Honneur and of the other military medals which it also commemorates.



International Congress of Science and Geography, Paris 1875, Copper Participants Medal, issued by the Geographical Society (founded 1821), figures of Europ, Asia, Africa and America stand by altar and tree (of knowledge), rev legends, 68mm. Mint state. £60-80



Exposition Universelle Internationale, Paris 1878, large Bronze Medal, by Eugène André Oudiné, Marianne stands with Mercury and Godesses of the Arts and Industry, naked figure reclines below, *rev* infant genii hold up plan of the Exhibition, 86mm. *Extremely fine*. £60-80



Étienne-Jules Marey (1830-1904), physiologist, Silvered-bronze Plaquette, 1900, by Paul Richer, bust of Marey to left, *rev* Marey seated at a desk in a laboratory, on clouds above are athletes and horses advancing left, 50mm x 63mm (Storer 2364; Brettauer 746). *Nearly extremely fine and scarce.* £80-100

Étienne-Jules Marey (1830-1904) was a French scientist and chromo-photographer. His work was significant in the development of cardiology, physical instrumentation and aviation. He is widely considered to be a pioneer of photography and developments leading up to the early cinema.



Paris, the Palace Hotel, Silvered-bronze Plaquette, by F C V de Vernon (1861-1940), an Arab Nobleman is welcomed at the hotel, *rev* view of the building and the Champs Elysées, 70mm x 54mm (BDM VI p.238). *About extremely fine, rare.* £80-100

The piece is believed to have been struck to coincide with the Paris Exposition of 1900.



Georges Goyau (1869-1939), religious historian, Bronze Tribute Medal, undated, by P M Dammann, bust left, in old age, *rev* legend below ship, MISSIS CATHOLICS ..., 81mm. *Very fine*. £60-80



Maréchal Ferdinand Foch (1851-1929), circular Bronze Portrait Plaquette, by Auguste Maillard, for Paris-Art, uniformed bust left, a raised numeral "1" before truncation, 114mm. *Extremely fine*.

The raised numeral suggests that the medal may well be a trial striking. A similar but un-numbered example was sold by Jean Elsen, 11 December 2010 (lot 1364)

Revolutionary and Napoleonic France, uniface lead Plaquettes (6), by Andrieu, The Arrival of the King in Paris before execution, with contemporary loop affixed, Napoleon (3), including the Battle of Maréngo, Josephine (2). *Generally extremely fine, the first mounted.* (6) £200-300



Alsace and Lorraine, Copper Medals (3), Hugh, tree representing the line of Alsace, *rev* text; Gerard II, lion left, *rev* text; Adalbert, hand opening the Bible, *rev* text. *Good very fine*. (3) £60-80

Germany



Saxony, Johann Friedrich (1503-1532-1547), cast Gilt-silver Medal, by Hans Reinhart, bust three-quarters right, wearing gown and chain of office, *rev* battle scene, 43.5mm. *Old mount-mark to top and (crudely) pierced, the gilding contemporary, fine.* £120-150



George Ludwig (1660-1698-1727; George I of England, 1714), Brunswick-Lüneburg-Calenberg-Hannover, heavy Silver Medal, to the weight of 5-Thalers, 1700, by Raimund Faltz, armoured bust left, mantle around, *rev* Hanoverian horse to left, NEC SPERA TERRENT over rocks, 65mm (Brockm 796; Fiala 2882; Alnwick II, 201). *Some scuffs and bruises, slight 'bend' to obverse, very fine and rare.* £400-600

Prussia, Frederick the Great (1712-1740-1786), Death, Silver Medal, 1786, by Loos, crowned bust, rev figure kneels at altar, 42mm; German Friendship Silver Medal, 17th / 19th Century, Piety and Justice at altar, rev Hope on rock, holding anchor, 33mm; Belgium, Ypres, Jeton de Presence, 1854, by J Wiener, arms, rev events of the year, including opening of the railway, 33mm; France, Jean de la Quintinie, director of the royal fruit and vegetable gardens, Silver Horticultural Society Medal, by A Bovy, bust left, rev wreath, 50mm. First three fine, first deeply toned, the last very fine. (4) £80-120



Brandenburg-Prussia, Princess Victoria, Princess Royal, Queen of Prussia and German Empress, later known as the Empress Frederick (1840-1901), Silver Medal, by Uhlman and Loos, elegant portrait left, seen partly from behind, *rev* crowned arms of England and Germany, linked by a chain of the Order of the Black Eagle, 56mm. *The edge somewhat pared, otherwise extremely fine and rare.* £400-600



167 Hamburg, Commerce and Industry Exhibition, Bronze Medal, 1889, by C Lauer, figure of Hamburg seated, view of the city behind her including the spires of St Michael, St Nicholas and St Catherine, rev shield and legend, 70mm (Gaedechens 2349). Good extremely fine. £80-120



Alfred Krupp (1812-1887), metallurgist and industrialist, Centenary of his birth, oval Silver Medal, 1912, by H Hahn, bust left, *rev* Vulcan at forge, 63mm x 37mm, integral suspension loop. *Nearly very fine*. £50-70



Association of Sea, Air and Land, 1860-1910, Bronze Jubilee Medal, by Awes of Berlin, view of Dresden, *rev* winged female figure standing on dolphin, shipping beyond, 60mm. *Extremely fine*. £80-100

Malatesta and his mistress Isotta degli Atti are the subject of the greater part of de' Pasti's work.

Vigilius d'Aytta de Zuichem was city councillor in Speyer and professor in Ingolstadt, Germany. A friend of Erasmus and protégé of Granvelle, in 1549, under the Emperor Charles V, he was President of the state council in Brussels. He was also a prolific bibliophile and numismatist, with one of the most important libraries in the Low Countries and a formidable collection of ancient coins and medals.

The medal is believed to be unpublished. Herbert Edward Vosper set up Vosper & Co when he was only 21 in 1871 at Camber, a small commercial dock on the east side of the entrance to Portsmouth harbour. The main work of the Company during the early years was largely in the refitting and repair of coastal vessels. The soon prosperous company began producing their own range of steam reciprocating engines which were fitted into all types of craft, including yachts, tugs, tenders and launches, for the Admiralty and for export. One of the first vessels that the Company built was the tug Hercules for the Shoreham Harbour Authority. Vosper & Co proved to be an early pioneer of the internal combustion engine, developing vaporising paraffin and crude oil engines. It eventually merged with JT Thornycroft.

The Nestorian Stele stands nearly 3 metres tall and was erected c.781, documenting 150 years of history of early Christianity in China. The purpose of the expedition was to obtain the Stele and sell it to a European Museum. Prevented by the Chinese from doing this, Holm had an exact copy made which he shipped to America where it was exhibited in the Metropolitan Museum, New York. In 1917 it was purchased by a Mr George Leary and presented to the Pope.

Albert Bruce-Joy (1842-1924), was a prolific British sculptor, born in Dublin, however the medal was struck in America by the Medallic Art Company, New York and bears their stamp and the numeral "1".

The medal, which is unsigned and possibly dates from the 1920s, is curious in that it gives no clue as to who issued it. The Company, based in Warlinham, Surrey, published *Potter's Cyclopaedia of Botanical Drugs & Preparations* (London, 1900) and hold the patent for 'Wasp-Eze'.



Olympic Games, and International Exposition, Paris 1900, Silvered-bronze Plaquette, by O Roty, winged female figure affixing torch to a tree, *rev* open square with buildings, 26mm x 51mm, unnamed, but as given to Judges and Referees (Gad 3). *Extremely fine*. £60-80

Orange Association, Ireland, Silver Medal of the 5th Committee, c.1798, by W Mossop, within Gilt-bronze laurel wreath border, equestrian portrait of William as Roman General, to left, THE GLORIOUS & IMMORTAL MEMORY 1690, *rev* Royal arms and supporters, KING AND CONSTITUTION, the border engraved both sides, 1672 – 5th COMMITTEE, 67mm x 56mm, flat suspender (BHM 493; D&W 172/545). *Extremely fine, rare*.

The Loyal Orange Institution was founded after the "Battle of the Diamond" near Loughgall, Co Armagh, on 21 September 1795, a skirmish between the Roman Catholic Defenders and the Protestants of the area. When it ended the Protestants formed a circle, joined hands and declared their brotherhood in loyalty to the Crown, the country and the Reformed religion.

The first Orange parades were held on 12 July 1796 at Portadown, Lurgan and Waringstown. In 1798 a large parade was held at Lurgan where the General Officer Commanding in Ulster, Lieutenant-General Lake, inspected the parade. It was after quashing the Rebellion of 1798, when the Orangemen sided with the Crown, that the English Government decided to unite the London and Dublin governments. The decision was deeply resented by most Orangemen, though the then Grand Master, Thomas Verner, was in favour of the plan.
