This impressive issue was struck to commemorate the marriage of Alexander Balas to Cleopatra Thea in c.150 BC. Cleopatra Thea (c.164-121 BC), the daughter of Ptolemy VI and Cleopatra II of Egypt, played an important role in the Seleucid monarchy, while also leading a rather complicated and turbulent existence. Her union with Alexander I produced a child, Antiochos VI. Alexander was killed in 145 BC, after which Cleopatra married Demetrios II and bore him their sons Seleukos V and Antiochos VIII. Demetrios was later captured by the Parthians, whereupon Cleopatra married Antiochos VII; their son was Antiochos IX. Demetrios was released by the Parthians only to be murdered on the orders of Cleopatra Thea in 125 BC. She then arranged for the death of her son Seleukos V, who had succeeded Demetrios, before attempting to place herself as ruler of Syria, along with her son Antiochos VIII. After attempting to also remove him, she was forced to take her own life in 121 BC.

The above example was one of the first two of this issue to be discovered in the late 19th century.

There seems to be a confusion over two different examples of this type of coin in the Naismith publication, which partly emanates from an incorrect provenance chain given in a Spink Auction catalogue for Naismith coin C22.1n. The coin illustrated shares the same reverse die as the coin offered herewith, however the obverse die with the archiepiscopal letters eP are the correct orientation on the Naismith coin, but retrograde on this example herewith. The coin identified and illustrated as Naismith C22.1n is ex Lucien La Riviere, Spink Auction, 9 October 2002, lot 968, Stacks, 7 December 1994, lot 2329 and David Dupree Collection purchased by Spink 1989. The entry in the publication has confused some of that provenance with some for the coin herewith with a consequence that this coin offered here has been omitted from the Naismith book. THE QUENTIN ARCHER COLLECTION OF RUSSIAN MEDIEVAL COINS

The attribution to specific territories and rulers of many of the earlier coins is subject to debate. In cases of doubt the conclusions of more recent authors have been preferred to those of their predecessors.

For the period up to and including the reign of Vasilii Vasilievich (1425-1462) the order below is based on that used in Oreshnikov (1896). Zaitsev (2006) is followed for coins of the reigns of Ivan Vasilievich and Vasilii Ivanovich (1462-1533), and the works of Kleshchinov and Grishin (1998-2007) for the hammered coinage between 1533 and 1716.

Commodore Howe and General Bligh led the second English Expedition to St Malo and had destroyed much of the French Fleet at Cherbourg, because of bad weather the army proceeded towards St Cast but encountered the Duc d'Aiguillon and 15,000 French troops. The main force retreated but, on the 12th September, the rear-guard, under General Drury, attacked Aiguillon. The losses on both sides were extensive, many English prisoners were taken, and the wounded Drury was drowned attempting to swim to a ship.



George II (1727-1760), State of Britain, Gilt Lead Medal, 1760, by Johann Carl Hedlinger, laureate and cuirassed bust with sash left, GEORGIUS II. The medal expresses the exceptionally high regard in which Britain was held across Europe after the events of the previous two years. MI suggests the dies were never hardened which would explain why the only example Hawkins, Franks and Grueber could cite was also in lead. Extant examples are effectively trials. This extremely rare medal is possibly one of only two in existence.

William Sidney Smith joined the navy aged 11, and his bravery at the battle of Cape St Vincent in 1780 brought him the unprecedented appointment as Lieutenant for one so young. He saw action in the American War of Independence and served in the Swedish navy (he was knighted for his bravery). In the Napoleonic Wars he was captured at Le Havre, but later escaped from the Temple prison in Paris back to England. Helped by Turkish forces he orchestrated the heroic defence of Acre against Napoleon. He received his British knighthood for his services to Wellington following Waterloo. He died in Paris and his tomb in the Père Lachaise Cemetery reproduces the David medal in marble.

Phipp's political career began as MP for Scarborough. He was Governor of Jamaica, 1832-1834, Lord Privy Seal, 1834, and Lord Lieutenant of Ireland, 1835.

Exhibitions, Important International Prize Medals (3), in Copper awarded to John Corbett, MP (1817-1901), "The Salt King" and proprietor of the Stoke Prior Salt Works, near Droitwich, comprising: The United States Centennial Exposition, Philadelphia, 1876, 76mm, named on edge, "Awarded to John Corbett M.P. Stoke Prior Salt Works. Worcestershire", in case of issue; The Sydney International Exhibition, 1879, 76.5mm, named on the reverse, "J. Corbett. M.P. First Award", in case of issue; and The Melbourne International Exhibition of 1880, 76mm, named on edge, "J. Corbett M.P. Worcester. Salt", this without case. *All extremely Fine.* (3)

The Stoke Prior Salt Works, which grew into an enormous undertaking, was bought by Corbett between 1853 and 1857, following the bankruptcy of the British Alkali Company. Corbett rapidly expanded the previously failing business, taking advantage of the existing canals and expanding with the growing railway network. The sale of the business to the Salt Union Ltd in 1888 included three locomotives and over 400 wagons and vans. Annual output rose to 200,000 tons of salt. He built housing for his workforce as well as gardens, schools, lecture rooms, a club house and a dispensary, and in 1859 he abolished female labour at the works. He was elected the Liberal MP for Droitwich in 1874, building his home nearby, the splendid Chateau Impney, which is now a hotel.

Alfred Fowler CBE FRS (1868-1940), astronomer, emeritus Professor of Astrophysics at Imperial College, distinguished for his contribution to the understanding of sunspots and solar eclipses, recipient of the Royal Society Medal and President of the Royal Astronomical Society.



"Dacia", Bronze Medal, undated, by Sydney William Carline (1888-1929), girl's head left, her hair plaited and tied covering her ear, rev Dacia, semi-clad, dances, 66mm. Extremely fine and extremely rare.

Sydney William Carline and his brother Richard Carline (1896-1980) both studied at the Slade School and in Paris under Tudor Hart. They joined the RAF in World War I, and Sydney was an official War Artist, but both are remembered for their war paintings. Their sister Hilda, also Slade trained and a considerable artist herself, married Stanley Spencer. He exhibited with the London Group, becoming a member in 1924. From 1921 to 1929 he was Ruskin Master of Drawing at Oxford. He provided some illustrations for T E Lawrence's *Revolt in the Desert*. He experimented with medal design, mostly portraits but not exclusively so. In antiquity the Dacians inhabited the Carpathian-Danube region – present day Romania. A preliminary drawing for this medal is in the British Museum [1980,0126.36].

The Bromsgrove Guild of Applied Arts was established in 1894 by Walter Gilbert who had taken over a foundry in Bromsgrove, Worcestershire.

Marion Harry Alexander Spielmann, editor of *The Connoisseur* and the *Magazine of Art*, was deeply interested in medallic art, be it from the past or the new as recognised by this personal tribute from Frank Bowcher. The plaquette was exhibited at the Royal Academy in 1923 (1439). Spielmann presented examples to the National Portrait Gallery, the Victoria & Albert Museum and the Athenaeum Club. Gleichen - Princess Feodora Georgina Maude von Hohenlohe-Langenburg (1861-1922).

The Kitchener medal was exhibited at the Salon des Artistes Français in 1920.

Schwartz studied drawing in Budapest from the age of 14 and in 1867 he went to Vienna and joined the renowned bronze and silver manufacturers Dziedzinski & Hanusch & Klinkosch. In 1870 he started to study at the Kunstgewerbeschule in Vienna under the sculptor Otto König. In 1884 he was appointed a professor at the Kunstgewerbeschule.

When he died (of pneumonia in his suite at the Waldorf) it was reported that he would be leaving his racing automobile to the Kaiser [Wilhelm II], but there was no mention of this in his will. The son of Lieutenant-Admiral Martin Harpertzoon Tromp (1597-1653), Cornelius Tromp fought in the three Anglo-Dutch Wars, saving much of the Dutch fleet following the Battle of Lowestoft in 1665. In 1673, in his flagship, the *Gouden Leeuw*, he was at the Battle of Texel, where his enemy Edward Spragge was drowned. In 1675 he was created an English Baronet. Later he commanded the Danish Navy against the Swedes at the Battle of Öland in 1677. The medal would seem to be of the same workshop as the double-sided bronze medal of Admiral Cornelius Evertsen (1610-1666), for the Battle of the Four Days, which was sold at Baldwin's Auction 51, 25 April 2007, lot 1560.



The Successful Outcome of the Attempted Attack on Amsterdam by William II and the Imprisonment of the Regents in Loevestein, cast Silver Medal with reverse in imitation of engraving, unsigned (Pieter van Abeele), c.1650, cityscape of Amsterdam with spires and windmills, the harbour to the fore with several city barges, hand of God in clouds above and legend on scroll, *rev* two coaches leave a gateway above which hangs a smoking cage, troops march alongside, the castle of Loevenstein beyond, 64.5mm (vL II, 345, 1; Fred 1b, 26). *Very fine and very rare*.

William II, unhappy with the Treaty of Münster and the State of Holland's wish to reduce troop levels, attempted a surprise attack on Amsterdam. This failed and the medal's reverse compares the imprisonment of the Regents with the attempt by Herman de Ruyter to capture Loevenstein.

It is said that various scientists were forced to write the many papers published in her name.

Louis-Marie, Vicomte de Noailles (1756-1804), French General and Politician, who served under Lafayette in North America and negotiated Cornwallis's surrender after Yorktown in 1781, Wedgwood Creamware Portrait Medallion, c.1790, bewigged bust to right, tied in a queue, 87.5mm x 66.5mm, stamped WEDGWOOD on back (Reilly & Savage, 1973, p.260, "previously unrecorded"). Made with a small piercing to the top (a slight chip where it penetrates the back), much as made and exceptionally rare.

De Noailles, the second son of Marshal de Mouchy, had served in America with Lafayette, his cousin and brother-in-law. He fought with d'Estaing at Savannah, and was present throughout the Yorktown campaign in Virginia where he was entrusted by Washington to be one of those who negotiated the terms of the final surrender. Following his service in the American Revolution he returned to France and was elected in 1789 to the States-General. He presided over the Constituent Assembly in 1791 and proposed the abolition of titles and liveries of the nobility. Noailles fled to America (by way of England) when the reign of terror started, where he became a wealthy partner in Bingham's Bank in Philadelphia. He left the bank to accept a command against the English in San Domingo. He was sailing for Havana in Cuba when he encountered a British man-of-war. Although he won the action, he was shot in the chest and died shortly after reaching Havana.

The cataloguers are unaware of any metal medallic portraits of de Noailles, nor have they been able to trace any other examples in Creamware in public collections. The portrait is taken from an engraving by Jean-Baptiste Verité. His painting by Gilbert Stuart hangs in the Metropolitan Museum in New York, whilst the action in which he was killed was painted by Jean Gudin.

- 7.7. Your right to return the Lot and receive a refund of the Hammer Price under the Guarantee is your sole remedy against us, our agents and subcontractors and/or the Seller for a Forgery. You will not be entitled to claim interest on the amount due to you. 
