

East Prussian Coinage of Elizabeth I



A Collection of Russian Coinage for East Prussia

Involving all of Europe's powers at the time and fought on a global stage, the Seven Years War (1756-1763) was arguably the first world war. Friedrich the Great's emergent Prussia, with one of Europe's best armies, and Great Britain, with Europe's largest navy, joined with a coalition of smaller German states to battle an alliance of France, Austria, Russia, Sweden and Saxony.

On the eastern front, the Russian army under Field Marshal Stepan Feodorovich Apraxin defeated the Prussians on August 30, 1757 at Gross-Jagersdorf. The gates of East Prussia were wide open, but Apraxin inexplicably did not take advantage of his victory and went into winter quarters. An irate Elizabeth Petrovna transferred command of her military forces to General Villim Fermor. On January 16, 1758, Fermor with a Russian army of some 30,000 troops marched from Memel into East Prussia and the area was quickly occupied and annexed.

At the outset of the occupation, the Russian army found itself suffering great financial losses. Coins of a number of German States were circulating in East Prussia, and these coins were quite often of low-grade silver with varying weights. To compound the situation, counterfeit coins flooded the marketplace. Thus the Russian army found itself taking in debased coinage and paying out in good silver. To alleviate the situation, a special Russian coinage utilizing the Taler system was approved for East Prussia.

Designs for this new coinage were created by A.T. Bolotov and dies cut by Wolf, the engraver at the Königsberg mint. Production was done both at the mints of Königsberg and Moscow and coins were produced from 1759 to 1762. For the last year, only 6 Groschen from the Krasny mint are known (Krasny mint records show the striking of 64,000 one-third Taler pieces, but no examples are known). Despite a mintage of 120,000 pieces, these 6 Groschen are very rare, a rarity explained by the year's events.

With the death of the childless Empress Elizabeth, her chosen heir and nephew Peter of Holstein-Gottorp gained the throne. In context to the Seven Years War, Elizabeth's death is often called the "Miracle of the House of Brandenburg." A great admirer of Prussia's King Friedrich II, Peter withdrew Russia from its wartime alliance, returned to Prussia the territories previously annexed and ceased production of the special Russian coinage for East Prussia. Agents for King Friedrich II were sent to systematically search out and buy up all the offensive Russo-Prussian coinage wherever it could be found. Not surprisingly, the agents were also instructed to seek out and purchase any medal for the Russian victory over the Prussians at the Battle of Kunersdorf (Friedrich's most devastating defeat).

This rare and unusual overdate-overinitials coin poses a mystery as to the actual sequence of dies and production. Stepan Afonasiev (CA) was mintmaster from 1764-1770. At some point at the end of 1769, it would seem that new dies were prepared for the next year which included his initials (less likely is the scenario that these new dies were prepared during the first weeks of 1770, but not impossible). Hence it was assumed Afonasiev would be mintmaster in 1770. There are 1770 Rubles with the initials CA, but these are quite Rare and we must surmise that the emission was very small or that most of it was destroyed. At some point in 1770, Yakov Chernishev became mint master. So Afonasiev died in office, had to leave unexpectedly or was removed abruptly. Chernishev had no time to prepare new dies, but production was required, so be took the 1769 dies and cut the new date and his initials over the previous. Why didn't he use the 1770 CA dies and just cut over the initials? Asking this question would lead us to believe that these dies had already been destroyed. The other possibility, and that is an outside one, is that after the overdate overinitial issue, when new dies were cut, the old initials CA were used in error. And when the error was discovered, the emission was stopped and the die removed from usage. This intriguing coin certainly welcomes further research.



A Grafin of the noble German Baltic Medem family, Anna Charlotte Dorothea von Medem was born in 1761 at Mezotne Palace in what is now Latvia. On her father's side she was a descendant of Konrad von Mandern, Master of the Livonian Order (1263-1266). In 1779, this young beauty married Duke Peter von Biron of Courland. She would bear him six children, one, though — her namesake Dorothea, illegimately.

Beset at home dealing with political difficulties, Peter von Biron found it necessary to send his young wife away on frequent diplomatic missions. Separated from her home and husband for long periods, the vivacious Anna Dorothea became involved in love affairs with various men, including the French statesman and noted womanizer Tallyrand and Alexander Batowski, a Polish nuncio, who was most likely the father of her last daughter Dorothea (who Peter von Biron nonetheless acknowledged as his own).

Upon the marriage of her daughter Dorothea to Tallyrand's nephew Edmond de Tallyrand-Perigord in 1809, Anna Dorothea moved to Paris. It is possible that this medal served as a medallic calling card for the Dutchess in what would be a whole new society for her.

Marriage Commemoratives of 1841



In 1838, Grand Duke Alexander Nikolaevich, heir to the Russian throne became smitten with Princess Maximiliane Wilhelmine Auguste Sophie Marie of Hesse-Darmstadt, then only 14. By the summer of 1840, Alexander decided he wished to marry her. The princess arrived in St. Petersburg in September, was immediately popular with the people and was soon rechristened Maria Alexandrovna. On the 16th of April, Alexander and Maria were married in an elaborate ceremony. Three months earlier, the Emperor ordered that designs be prepared by the State Mint for medallic issues to honor the marriage. Heinrich Gube duly responded. The Wedding in fact would become the most numismatically celebrated events in Russian history – producing a Medallic Rouble and Medals, in three metals and in a number of varieties. The advent of mint-produced commemorative issues in Russia had occurred only seven years earlier with the 1834 Alexandrine Column and in 1841 commemoratives were still a most exciting novelty

A Corsician noble and diplomat, Count Pozzo di Borgo (1764-1842) was originally a boon friend and companion to the Bonaparte brothers, his fellow Corsicans, Joseph and Napoleon. But by the 1790's, their political paths diverged and Charles-Andre found himself in opposition to the Bonapartes. Through the influence of Prince Adam Czartoryski, Charles-Andre entered the Russian diplomatic service in 1804. The Tilsit alliance between Russia and France in 1807 however interrupted his career. In 1812, Tsar Alexander recalled Pozzo di Borgo to Russian service, and Charles-Andre was made a general in the Russian army. When the Allies occupied Paris in 1814, he served as commissary general to the provisional government, and under the First Restoration, he was the Russian Ambassador to France. After the Second Restoration, Charles-Andre remained in France and was instrumental in smoothing out the reluctance of Tsar Nicholas to accept the accession of Louis-Philippe. In 1835, Pozzo di Borgo was abruptly transferred to the London embassy as St. Petersburg had grown to believe that he favored French interests too much. In 1839, Charles-Andre retired from service and returned to Paris.





The Walter Alexander Mooromsky Collection

Walter Alexander Mooromsky (1927-2003) was born April 29, 1927, in China, to Russian parents. His father, Alexander Petrovitch Mooromsky, had been born near Penza, south-east of Moscow, at the end of the 19th century. The exact date is a mystery as he lied about his age to get in to the Tsar's Army, and we think gave a different year when he emigrated to San Francisco in 1930. The family considers 1898 to be his birth year. In 1917, he joined the White Army to fight the Bolsheviks. A fervent Monarchist to the day he died, he never believed that any of the Romanov Royal Family escaped the slaughter in July 1918 – having been in the first White Army to reach Ekaterinburg after the Royal Family was murdered and having seen the site. He continued to fight during the Civil War through 1921, serving with pride under General Molchanoff. With the fighting coming to an end, the remnant of the White Army in Eastern Russia realized they needed to leave their beloved Motherland and they walked across the Gobi Desert to escape the Reds. Only a fraction survived this journey. Arriving in Harbin, China, Alexander met Zoya Anoufrovna Rogulsky and they were married there. Their son Vladimir Alexandrovitch was born in Tientsin. As a family they emigrated to California, arriving in San Francisco – Angel Island – in March 1930. At this point Vladimir Alexandrovitch was renamed Walter Alexander.

Walter attended Lowell High School and graduated from the University of California Berkeley. He served proudly in both the U.S. Navy and the U.S. Army in WWII and Korea. He was a long time employee and executive with Levi Strauss & Co., which moved him to Brussels, Belgium, in 1962 to set up a European marketing and distribution operation. He remained in Brussels for 16 years, having made a second home there. He returned to the U.S. in the early 1980s via a three year stay in Montreal, Canada. His interests were many, as were his passions and loyalties. He was deeply proud of his Russian heritage, always finding the time to participate in various Russian activities. He carried on his family's love and honor of Mother Russia, and started his collection of Russian orders and decorations while living in Belgium in the 1960s and 1970s. There he had ready access to some of the great auction houses and dealers of Europe, enabling him to build his collection. To him this collection was about keeping alive the memory and honoring the country of his ancestors. It is his family's hope that these pieces will continue to do so in the hands of others.
